TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for primary care providers including family practice physicians, internists, physician assistants, advanced nurse practitioners, nurses and anyone with interest in endocrine and diabetes care.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a new comprehensive 1.5 day course on the principles of endocrinology and diabetes geared towards primary care providers. There is an immense need for education in these areas as there have been vast changes in the field of endocrinology over the past decade. Primary care providers often are faced with diagnosing many endocrine conditions such as thyroid disorders, treatment of osteoporosis, as well as male and female gonadal issues. Highlighted offerings on day 1 include plenary lectures on testosterone replacement in men, osteoporosis update and workshops with interactive case management discussions. Current controversies in lipid management due to recent guideline changes and use of obesity drugs will be reviewed. Also included is a half day focus on diabetes, the incidence of which reaches 10% in the general population. This part of the program will provide timely information on new clinical trial data and address use of new therapeutic strategies in diabetes. A key feature is a plenary lecture on cost issues related to diabetes management.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Recognize and treat common gonadal disorders in men and women
- · Interpret abnormal thyroid function tests
- Discuss diagnosis and treatment of osteoporosis
- Identify and appropriately manage lipid disorders
- Review the role of medication in the management of obesity
- Discuss new therapeutics and cost issues in treatment of diabetes
