


CURRENT CONCEPTS IN DRUG THERAPY

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for primary care providers including general internists, family practitioners, and allied health professionals.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

As primary care providers we are constantly encountering a dizzying array of medication options and patient questions regarding advertised medications. We are responsible for managing complex medication regimens including treatments we may not be intimately familiar with. In addition, safety concerns and new indications for old medications arise regularly. In order to help primary care providers keep up to date on these issues we have organized this CME course on Current Concepts in Drug Therapy. Through the use of a case-based format the speakers will highlight innovations in drug therapies, review new indications for old medications and discuss medication side effects and drug interactions. Individual presentations will be followed by panel discussions during which participants will be able to ask questions.

- Evaluate the risks and benefits of new outpatient drug therapies.
- Discuss new developments in the drug treatment of selected outpatient clinical conditions.
- Make more informed drug treatment decisions in the outpatient setting.
