24th Annual Clinical Cardiology Pearls for Primary Care



Friday May 2, 2025 Live Webinar

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for primary care providers, including naturopathic physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, physicians, physician associates, psychologists, and others interested in cardiology.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course offers practical, up-to-date insights on common cardiovascular diseases. Expert faculty from the University of Washington School of Medicine will use case-based lectures and interactive tools to promote engagement. Topics include recent guidelines on hypertension, cholesterol management, primary prevention, atrial fibrillation, and heart failure, as well as the diagnosis and treatment of coronary artery disease, valvular heart disease, and arrhythmias. Practical issues like anticoagulant use and appropriate cardiovascular imaging will also be covered. The course concludes with a comprehensive multiple-choice review session led by the course chairs.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Manage high blood pressure using updated guidelines (2017 ACC/AHA, 2020 ISH).
- Apply cholesterol guidelines and novel treatments for patients with cardiac risk factors and atherosclerotic disease.
- Classify chest pain and select appropriate stress and imaging tests based on current guidelines.
- Prescribe evidence-based diet and exercise plans to lower cardiovascular risk.
- Evaluate valvular heart disease, identifying when to refer for echocardiograms or valve repair/replacement.
- Treat palpitations and determine when to use heart rhythm monitors or refer to cardiology.
- Manage atrial fibrillation with anticoagulants, rhythm control, or specialist referral as needed.
- Treat heart failure with guideline-directed therapies, including novel drugs like ARNI and SGLT2 inhibitors.
