TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for primary care providers and urologists who are seeking an update on important clinical topics in men's health. The course is also well-suited for nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, naturopathic doctors, fellows, and residents.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Men experience a disproportionate burden of urologic conditions, making "Men's Health" a vital area of clinical focus that demands specialized expertise. The landscape of diagnosis and treatment in this field continues to evolve rapidly, driven by innovations in imaging, pharmaceuticals, and surgical technologies. One of the greatest challenges for clinicians is staying current with these advancements to ensure optimal patient care. This program brings together expert faculty to deliver a comprehensive update on key topics including prostate cancer screening and management, testosterone deficiency, male urinary tract issues, kidney and bladder disorders, sexual dysfunction, infertility, and chronic genital pain syndromes. Following the plenary presentations, attendees will have the opportunity to engage directly with faculty during interactive Q&A sessions.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Associate the role of PSA screening in men and describe additional tests now available for prostate cancer screening and diagnosis.
- Extrapolate a more holistic approach to men's health, including the complex interplay between common comorbidities.
- Illustrate the management options for men with localized prostate cancer, including active surveillance.
- Give examples of the quality-of-life issues men face after prostate cancer treatment and develop a paradigm for addressing common issues.
- Interpret diagnostic criteria in the evaluation of men with microscopic and gross hematuria.
- Distinguish the relationship between cardiovascular disease and erectile dysfunction and offer appropriate treatment options to men experiencing ED and other forms of sexual dysfunction.
- Point out the association between male infertility and disease, and discuss the evidence-based evaluation of male infertility.
- Classify the key elements of a BPH evaluation and provide appropriate treatment options.
- Generate the appropriate evaluation of men with scrotal content pain and discuss an evidencebased initial treatment approach.
- Explain the approach to evaluating chronic male genitourinary pain and the various treatment options available.
