What's in a name? Authentic Connections in Medical Education

For teachers, making connections with learners is a high-yield to create psychological safety and create a positive learning climate. A person's window of tolerance for discomfort and uncertainty opens wider and allows for richer learning in situations where the learner feels safe having connections with teachers and colleagues helps with that.

Brad Sharpe is a master clinician-teacher, former APD for internal medicine and division head for hospital medicine at UCSF, winner of numerous teaching awards.

After the Grand Rounds, Brad will be joined by Jonathan Kanter, a clinical psychological scientist and expert on the science of social connections, as well as learners from UW to discuss connecting across differences. Learners will share their perspectives on the phenomenon of "connecting" with teachers and how it affects their educational experience.
