TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for family physicians, primary care providers, internists, pediatricians, osteopathic physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and others interested in primary care.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is the 44th year that the Department of Family Medicine at the University of Washington School of Medicine is offering five days of educational opportunities for family medicine and primary care health care providers.

Each year, our goal is to provide current information about practice skills and the diagnosis and management of a broad array of primary health care issues within family medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, psychiatry and behavioral science, neurology, sports medicine, women's health, pulmonology, nephrology, infectious disease, chronic pain, pediatrics, and gastroenterology. In addition, course content includes information about practice transformation in line with new health care legislation.

We offer a wide variety of interactive workshops to reinforce and integrate content that is shared in large group plenary sessions. We integrate educational methods that engage attendees and deepen learning during plenary sessions. We include an ABFM SAM (Self-Assessment Module). This module will help interested participants meet recertification requirements of the American Board of Family Medicine.
