WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Specialists in anesthesiology such as anesthesiologists, nurse anesthetists, and residents and fellows, pediatricians, neonatologists, perinatologists, obstetricians, general practitioners, delivery room nurses, nurse midwives, and clinical pharmacologists

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This conference will provide presentations from faculty experts and will be combined with hands-on workshops using state-of-the-art simulations and live models. The first day explores a variety of important obstetric anesthesiology themes via lectures, debates and problem-based discussions. Each presentation will allow ample time for interaction between the audience and presenters. The second day will access the University of Washington's state-of-the-art high-fidelity simulation center, the Institute for Simulation and Interprofessional Studies (ISIS). The center, a leader in the use of simulation technology to improve patient care, will be available for small group workshops as well as teaching via live models. We will focus on ultrasound guided TAP blocks, ultrasound facilitated neuraxial analgesia and management of the unexpected difficult airway.

- Identify parturients at risk for post-cesarean pain
- Successfully identify and manage post dural puncture headaches
- Improve technical skills pertaining to ultrasound guided Transversus Abdominis Plane (TAP) blocks and ultrasound guided epidural placement
