TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for primary care providers, including general internists, family practitioners, and allied health professionals.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

As primary care providers, we are constantly encountering a dizzying array of medication options and patient questions regarding advertised medications. We are responsible for managing complex medication regimens including treatments we may not be intimately familiar with. In addition, safety concerns and new indications for old medications arise regularly. Through the use of a case-based format, the speakers will highlight innovations in drug therapies, review new indications for old medications, and discuss medication side effects and drug interactions. Individual presentations will be followed by panel discussions during which participants will be able to ask questions.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Evaluate the risks and benefits of new inpatient and outpatient drug therapies.
- Discuss new developments in the drug treatment of selected clinical conditions.
- Make more informed drug treatment decisions in the outpatient setting.
- Identify and educate about new FDA approved medications from 2018-2020.
- Discuss important drug interactions and medication side effects.
- Review seminal articles supporting changes to prescribing practices.
