This meeting is intended for specialists working on any labor and delivery floor including anesthesiologists, obstetricians, nurse anesthetists, residents and fellows. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The 4th University of Washington Obstetric Anesthesia Conference will be another joint venture with the Obstetrics Department and the Anesthesiology Department. The conference will provide all L&D floor providers including anesthesiologists, OB/GYNs, nurse anesthetists, residents, and fellows with one full day of CME-accredited learning.

Presentations from faculty experts will be combined with hands-on workshops using state-of-the-art simulations. The first half of the day explores a variety of important themes about outcomes of labor and delivery patients via lectures, debates, and problem-based discussions. Each presentation will allow ample time for interaction with the audience.

The second half of the day will focus on simulations. Participants will experience small group workshops as well as teaching via live models.
