This course is designed for family medicine physicians, and other primary care providers including internists, pediatricians, osteopathic physicians, physician associate, nurse practitioners, and others interested in primary care.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is the 52nd year that the Department of Family Medicine at the University of Washington School of Medicine is offering information from a variety of disciplines including family medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, dermatology, OB-GYN, neurology, pulmonology, ophthalmology, and many other disciplines. The material presented will allow participants to acquire new information as well as review information important to building and maintaining skills valuable for the primary care provider. Review of evidence-based guidelines from recent studies and professional organizations as well as opportunities for hands on learning for those attending in-person will be available.

We are also excited to offer an optional one-day minicourse (Friday, September 13) focused on infectious disease updates for the busy family medicine and primary care provider with talks on immunization updates, travel medicine, antibiotic mythbusters, infections around the world, urinary troubles, tuberculosis, and STI updates.

Afternoon Schedule Options

We are excited to offer the Dermatology and Musculoskeletal Breakout sessions again this year. The first half of the breakout will be a didactic presentation, the format is listed below in the table, and the second half of the breakout will be a hands-on in-person only session with instruction by our faculty. The Dermoscopy Primer Breakout will be offered on Monday and Wednesday, and the Shoulder & Foot/Ankle Exam for the Primary Care Physician (APCO) Breakout will be offered on Tuesday and Thursday. The content will be the same for both offerings of the breakouts. The Dermoscopy Primer breakout sessions will be capped at 30 participants and the Shoulder & Foot/Ankle Exam breakout sessions will be capped at 40 participants.
