TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for non-specialist physicians and health professionals interested in fields such as Allergy/Immunology, Dermatology, Emergency Medicine, Family Medicine, Infectious Disease, Internal Medicine, Nursing, and Pediatrics. It is ideal for Naturopathic Physicians, Nurses, Pharmacists, Physician Associates, Students, Technicians, and other related professions.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-day hybrid conference, available in-person or via live webinar, offers an overview of travel medicine and global health for non-specialist physicians and health professionals. With the rise in international travel, clinicians must be prepared to tackle superbugs and antimicrobial resistance. Participants will learn from experts in travel medicine, global health, and infectious diseases, gaining the knowledge and skills to address travelers' complex health needs and improve global health outcomes. Staying current with the latest developments, attendees can enhance their ability to provide high-quality care to diverse patient populations in an interconnected world.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Provide guidance on preparing pre-travel patients for travel to low-income nations by conducting thorough pre-travel consultations and assessments.
- Discuss evidence-based recommendations for travel vaccinations and prophylaxis.
- Distinguish various strategies to volunteer for overseas medical service.
- Assess and recognize common risks faced by travelers to low-income nations including the recognition and management of common travelrelated illnesses and emergencies.
- Navigate ethical challenges in providing care to travelers and global populations.
