

Continuing Medical Education Upcoming 2023 Courses

June 22 - 23, 2023 Travel Medicine and Global Health

This in-person conference will provide an overview of travel medicine and global health and is targeted to non-specialist physicians and other health professionals with an interest in travel medicine and global health. (Hybrid: University of Washington Tower Auditorium or Live Webinar)

July 15, 2023 Interstitial Lung Disease Summit for the Primary Care Provider

The purpose of this activity is to increase awareness and knowledge of interstitial lung disease and pulmonary fibrosis among general practitioners. This summit was created in honor of Candace Norquist. Ms. Norquist's family wished to sponsor an educational experience to aid general practitioners in recognition and diagnosis of interstitial lung diseases. The content will focus on engaging and educating providers in recognition and diagnosis of interstitial lung disease. (South Lake Union Orin Smith Auditorium, Seattle, WA).

July 28 - 30, 2023 3rd North American Workshop on Ultrasound in Large Vessel Vasculitis

This course is designed to provide basic training for the rheumatologist in performing vascular ultrasound for the diagnosis of large vessel vasculitis. Hands-on training will be a significant component of this activity, partnered with expert faculty in the field, who will discuss and demonstrate how to identify the basic vascular pathological findings. Intermediate to advanced skill in the performance of ultrasound is strongly recommended as a prerequisite to this course (*Graduate Hotel*, *Seattle*, *WA*)

August 13 - 15, 2023 Emergency Radiology 2023

This hybrid course is designed to provide participants with an enhanced understanding of emergency radiology. Attendees will be able to utilize the knowledge gained from the course to optimize imaging protocols, incorporate standardized classification systems, implement updated approaches to management, make appropriate recommendations for incidental findings and ultimately improve patient care. Lecturers will include staff from the highly respected UW emergency radiology section, in addition to well-known radiologists from around the nation. September 11 - 14, 2023 51st Annual Advances in Family Medicine and Primary Care

Each year our goal is to provide current information about practice skills and the diagnosis and management of a broad array of primary health care issues within family medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, psychiatry and behavioral science, neurology, sports medicine, women's health, pulmonology, nephrology, infectious disease, chronic pain, pediatrics, and gastroenterology. This course is designed for family physicians and other primary care providers including internists, pediatricians, osteopathic physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and others interested in primary care. All clinicians providing primary care from all training backgrounds and specialties would benefit from this activity. (Hyrbrid: University of Washington, Husky Union Building or Live Webinar).

September 20 - 24, 2023 14th Annual Comprehensive Hematology & Oncology Review Course

This program is designed for fellows and physicians who are studying for the medical oncology and hematology certification and re-certification exams as well as clinical practitioners wanting to keep up to date on the latest developments in the field of oncology and hematology. This review course offers learners comprehensive reviews of the established standards of care and recent clinical advances in both medical oncology and hematology. October 19 - 20, 2023 Updates in Hospital Medicine

This program is designed for physicians, ARNPs, and PAs who take care of hospitalized general medicine patients. This includes subspecialty healthcare providers who work in inpatient settings. The purpose of the course is to update the skills of inpatient providers with a focus on common problems in clinical care. The format consists of brief, directed live or video presentations followed by discussions where participants will be able to ask the presenters questions. This format guarantees question and answer interaction time between faculty and attendees. (*Live Webinar*).
